What is Program Evaluation?

Evaluation is a systematic process for an organization to obtain information on its activities, its impacts, and the effectiveness of its work, so that it can improve its activities and describe its accomplishments.

How can evaluation improve our programs?

- By having data and feedback readily available we can make good business decisions.
- It also gives us the background to "Tell Our Story".

Telling Our Story

- Retain or increase funding
- Engage collaborators policymakers, partners, volunteers, advocates
- Recruit and retain talented staff
- Attract new participants
- Share innovations and success stories with similar programs

• Evaluation and Planning (Environmental) Assessment: Oral health stakeholders and other key leaders are asked to rate the current status of various elements that impact the implementation and success of a comprehensive public oral health plan.

Surveillance

- Reports and findings disseminated

- Do the proper individuals or groups receive the report?
- Are the findings usable and relevant to recipients?
