Program Highlights

- Dental benefits for Medicaid/SCHIP children include:
 - Diagnostic, preventive, restorative/surgical procedures and orthodontics
- Medicaid children: 346,000; SCHIP children: 74,000
- Dental benefits are not covered for adults except for limited oral surgery



Program Highlights (cont'd)

- Smiles for Children program consolidated dental services for all children (FFS and MCOs) in one program
 - ☐ Effective July 1, 2005;
 - □ Single vendor (Doral); streamlined credentialing; reduced authorization requirements; dedicated call center; industry-standard billing and claims processing
 - □30% increase in fees!



Program Goals

Implement effective case management services to ensure children and their parents are aware of the importance of receiving timely dental care, and to facilitate appropriate follow-up to help children find a dentist and keep their dental appointments



Program Goals (cont'd)

- Increase the number of dental specialists participating in the Smiles for Children program to provide specialty care
- Increase the utilization of oral health services by pregnant women under age 21 to improve their personal oral health and reduce the number of pre-term/low birth weight babies



Building the Infrastructure

- Case management program coordinated by new dental program administrator
- Network development programs and strategies to recruit specialists
- Outreach and educational programs to encourage pregnant women to access dental care



Using Continuous Quality Improvement

- Utilize Doral's data systems to track access, improve utilization, and address appointment "no-shows"
- Develop provider and client survey protocol to monitor program satisfaction

- Utilization rates
- Appointment "no-shows"
- Number of participating dentists & specialists
- Satisfaction survey results
