#### What is a Two-Tier Dental Home?

 Consists of both standard modeling – vertical (Private Dentists) and dispersed (horizontal – preventive, early detection, earlier treatment, and community centered

# I-Smile

#### Ongoing and Future Events?

Dispersed level = Integration AND Preventive Focus

- Physician trainings/expand primary care role in early oral health detection
- ☼ Statewide oral health promotion
- Open mouth school entrance screenings
- Dental Hygienists as Care Coordinators in public health settings
- Legislative request to improve the dental Medicaid program

#### **I-Smile**: The Future?

Increase Vertical Component

- Improving Medicaid
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> party payer carve out
  - 75 percentile or higher UCR rates
  - Carve-out dental payment structure for both primary care and dental providers
  - Improve state student loan repayment structure

# I-Smile: The Future Dental Home?

"Fill in the Gaps"

- Create new dental workforce of preventive and cheaper/deployable early treatment providers
- Reinstate Bachelor Degree Program for Dental Hygienists in Iowa
  - Public health/prevention emphasis
  - Partner with new Oral Health Practitioner programs at Metropolitan State University and U of Minnesota
  - Other new mid-level deployments (CDHC, Pediatric Dental Therapists?)
  - Create a new mid-level training model in Iowa? (DMU)

## Why Dental Hygienists?

- More flexible to public health applications
- Strong potential for educational advancement
- Numbers projected to rapidly exceed dentists
- Focus on prevention and population-based services *will talk to patients!*
- More likely to remain in Iowa and rural states!
- More comfortable with very young children

### Why Hygiene Advancement Now?

- Access issue worsening for underserved
- Technology advances improves potential service outreach to non-traditional settings
- New scope –of-practice laws recognizes non-traditional settings
- Linkages with dentists no longer require physical presence in private practice
- Rural communities need alternative models
