Some Things Will Not Change!

- Law does not "re-engineer" the health care system
- Current spend rate for health care is <u>not</u> sustainable
- Adjustments needed to be made
- Based on what we spend as a nation ??
 - Versus as a government ??
 - Or to reduce the national deficit??
- Where are the "cost-containment" provisions?

What Have We Learned?

- Massachusetts expanded access to insurance
 - In three years, only 2.7% of adult residents remain uninsured.
 - Largest expansion of coverage among those at 150% of FPL or less.
 - Publicly sponsored options didn't "crowd out" or replace employer-sponsored insurance.
 - However, 25% increase in premiums in small companies compared to larger companies
 - Concerns over primary care physician shortages
 - Concerns over gaming the system
