What happened?

State restored dental coverage for Medicaid-insured adults.

What's the impact?


- Potentially affects 775,000 people
- Costs the state \$24 million over the biennium



Messages that Resonated


Why?

- Opportunity to leverage federal dollars Medicaid expansion
- Dental-related visits to the ER are costly and don't address the problem. **\$36 million over 18 months**
- Poor oral health affects people's ability to get a job.
- *Untreated oral disease can have serious health consequences.



Messages that Resonated

Providing dental care can lead to medical cost savings, especially for people with diabetes. \$24 million in savings projected over the 2year budget cycle

- Radio & Online Advertising
- Grassroots Activity- Involved the Public
