#### **Assessment**

- Establish a Texas Oral Health Surveillance System
  - Assess oral health burden and trends
- Leadership
  - Texas Department of State Health Services, Oral Health Program



### **Policy Development**

- Build State Oral Health Infrastructure
  - Develop a strong oral health unit with a full-time state dental director and effective infrastructure
- Mobilize Support for Oral Health
  - Develop a state oral health coalition
- Leadership
  - Texas Department of State Health Services, Oral Health Program



#### **Assurance**

- Build Collaborative Partnerships to Implement:
  - Population-Based Oral Health Programs
  - Strategies to Increase Access to and Quality of the Oral Health Care System
    - Build collaborative collaborative partnerships and apply evidencebased prevention strategies
    - Remove barriers between people and the oral health care system
- Leadership
  - Executive Commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission
  - Texas Department of State Health Services, Oral Health Program

- Oral Health Coalition



### Evaluation – Resources What is identified and available?

- Oral Health Program infrastructure
- Funding state and national
- Leveraging opportunities
- Stakeholders public, private, corporate, academia, professional



# **Evaluation – Implementation What strategies will be utilized?**

- Current, on-going, planned projects
- Best practices
- Collaborations public, private, professional, non-traditional



### **Evaluation Results**

- Plan components address stakeholder, MCH, ASTDD, and other identified needs/guidance
- Leadership designations may not be appropriate
- Key resources missing
- Implementation opportunities not fully developed



### **Next Steps**

- Stabilization of the Oral Health Program
- Identify funding sources/opportunities
- Initiated statewide surveillance system
- Organized steering committee for oral health coalition
- Identify collaboration/partnering opportunities
- Leverage available resources



### **Next Steps - Continued**

- Development of:
  - Statewide oral health coalition
  - Partnerships for:
    - gathering surveillance data
    - school-based/school-linked dental sealant projects
    - preventive dental services for Early Head Start and Head Start enrollees
    - expansion of fluoridation efforts
  - Stronger relationships with organized dentistry and academic dental programs
