Arizona School of Dentistry & Oral Health

- Creating Competent, Caring Leaders in Community Health
- ATSU's Arizona School of Dentistry & Oral Health (ASDOH), was founded in 2003 as a result of evaluating regional and national needs for training dentists for underserved populations.
- School model influenced by Santa Fe Group recommendations for innovation in dental education.

ASDOH'S Mission

- To educate caring, technologically adept dentists who become community and educational leaders serving those in need and:
 - to be the leader in the lifelong education of community responsive dentists
 - to prepare graduates with a strong foundation of critical inquiry, evidence-based practice, research, cultural competency, an orientation to prevention, and interdisciplinary healthcare experiences
 - to promote the delivery of optimal patient care and for the transfer of newly acquired knowledge, skills, and technology to the profession and to the community

STATE DENTAL PILOT PROGRAM

Methods

- In 2006, the Arizona legislature allotted \$1,000,000 to fund the State Dental Pilot Program to provide dental services to adults (over 21) who are Title XIX eligible and enrolled with the Division of Developmental Disabilities (MR/DD i.e. "Cognitive Disability", Autism, Epilepsy, CP).
- \$925,000 for treatment, \$75,000 for transportation
- The Division of Developmental Disabilities contracted with ASDOH as the sole provider of dental services under this program creating a unique public/private partnership.



Covered Services

- Routine dental care:
 - Diagnostic & Preventive services
 - Restorative (including necessary crowns)
 - Endodontics (excluding re-treats and surgery)
 - Periodontics (including surgery)
 - Prosthodontics (including implants & implant supported dentures)
 - Oral Surgery

Adjunctive services (including behavior management, palliative emergency treatment & sedation)

Excluded Services

- Procedures deemed outside the scope/training of dental students
- GA (but could be provided in hospital setting)
- Orthodontics
- Complicated extractions, orthognathic and craniofacial surgery
- Periodontal soft & hard tissue grafting
- Multiple sets of dentures (unless directed by the faculty dentist)

Exceptions

- Exceptions to the process require District Program Manager Approval
- Consumers that live in ICF/MR settings excluded from program (*Dentistry is already* a covered service for this group.)


Contract Amendment

- Arizona Training Program at Coolidge (ATPC)
 - ASDOH also provides dental services to residents in this long-term care facility and consumers who live in group homes on the grounds

The Special Care Clinic

- Staffing: Full-time director, (DDS), Full-time faculty (DDS), Adjunct Faculty (1.25 FTE DDS), Part –time Dentist Anesthesiologist, One Full Time RDH, Two Full Time Dental Assistants
- State of the Art Facility: Fiber optics, electric motors, wheelchair lift, digital radiography, electronic dental records, cone beam tomography, soft and hard tissue lasers.

Innovative Modular Curriculum Second Year: didactic course in special care dentistry Comprehensive Clinical Experience Third and Fourth years: Clinical Rotations in Special Care Clinic* Hands-on application of state-of-the-art techniques utilizing cutting edge technology implants, lasers, tomography, Itero, Cerec, Velscope Integration of patients with special needs into student practice. From Oct 2006 until June 2007, the majority of student involvement was on a volunteer basis. Rotations have been implemented to meet CODA Std 2-26 "Graduates must be competent in assessing the treatment needs of patients with special needs."

Results Current Data Oct 2006 – present- 600 Pts./>6500 procedures/\$800,000 in dental care provided. March 2008 – Over 1800 referrals to date statewide. (approximately 10%)

Imporing On New ALTCS (Arizona Long Term Care Services) dental benefit started 10/1/07 provides \$1000.00/yr of coverage for dental services for adults with developmental disabilities (approximately 44,000 covered Arizonans) This is not a pilot program Future funding for coverage will require legislative approval State Dental Pilot Program sunsets June 30, 2008 Research Oral health related quality of life study of people with developmental disabilities (ATSU Strategic Research Fund grant) Longitudinal study on the impact of the special care dental training on workforce development (CVS grant)
