- Describe a desired vision for improvement including public, private, and safety net sources
- Recommend strategies to achieve the vision

### Recommendations Pertinent to Education, cont'd

- Increase recruitment of URM and rural students
- Develop a set of core competencies regarding oral for inclusion in the education and training of non dental health care professionals
- Recruit faculty with experience in caring for underserved and vulnerable populations

### Recommendations Pertinent to Education, cont'd

- HRSA should provide support for community placement of students
- HRSA should provide support for residency training in community-based settings
- States should require a minimum 1 year residency prior to licensing

### Recommendations Pertinent to Education, cont'd

 Public and private support for research into new methods, models of practice and technologies to better address unmet needs
